



# PRIMARY EDUCATION: what is and what might be

CPRT PEARSON AWARD FOR EVIDENCE-INFORMED TEACHING



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## **Purpose of the Award**

The CPRT Pearson Award for Evidence-Informed Teaching aims to recognise outstanding evidence-based practice in the primary school classroom which supports and develops one or more of the Cambridge Primary Review Trust's priorities. Award recipients will be serving teachers who can demonstrate the following:

- Teaching and learning that embraces and promotes one or more of CPRT's eight priorities (for details, see website) - equity, voice, community, sustainability, aims, curriculum, pedagogy, assessment - and that is firmly grounded in evidence about the conditions for effective pedagogy.
- Evidence, from classroom-based research or other sources, that demonstrates the positive impact of these approaches on pupils' learning and/or wellbeing.
- Evidence of sharing these ideas, approaches and outcomes with colleagues inside and/or outside the school.

## **Eligibility**

The award is open to anyone teaching in a primary, infant or junior school, including trainee teachers and NQTs.
