## **CPRT ASCL AWARD FOR EVIDENCE-INFORMED LEADERSHIP**

### **Purpose of the Award**

The CPRT ASCL Award for Evidence-Informed Leadership aims to recognise excellent leadership in primary education which supports and develops one or more of the Cambridge Primary Review Trust's priorities. Award recipients may be leading a school or a group of schools, or may be leading on a particular issue within a school or group of schools. Recipients are likely to demonstrate the following:

- Evidence of inspiring colleagues to embrace one or more of CPRT's eight priorities - equity, voice, community, sustainability, aims, curriculum, pedagogy, assessment - and of doing so by attending to evidence from CPR, CPRT and elsewhere.
- Evidence of sustainable impact in one of these areas.
- Evidence of a commitment to working with colleagues in other schools, including improving understanding between primary and secondary schools.

### **Eligibility**

The award is open to anyone in a leadership position in a primary, infant, junior or all-through school.
